

**County Commissioner Josh Reid and County Sheriff Mike Shea would like to answer a few questions that the community has had the past few weeks. Listed are a few of those questions.**

**Q: Do I need an ORV sticker?**

**A:** Yes, according to Michigan Motor Vehicle code 324.81115 you do need an ORV sticker.

**Q: How fast can I drive?**

**A:** 25 miles per hour maximum - less if posted.

**Q: Do I need a helmet?**

**A:** Yes, helmet and eye protection are required.

**Q: Are Golf Carts legal?**

**A:** A stock golf cart does not qualify as a legal ORV. Only modified golf carts that are capable of traveling through rough terrain qualify. Example: Knobby tires and a lift would qualify the golf cart.

**Q: Can I have a passenger?**

**A:** Only if the ORV has been manufactured with the intent of hauling passengers.

**Q: Does a “Gator” or that type of ORV qualify?**

**A:** Yes if they are 60” and under.

**Q: Do I need a class?**

**A:** If you have a valid driver’s license you do not need a class. If you don't, you will need a State Certified class and be under parental supervision.

**Q: Where can I get a map?**

**A:** You can get a map at most gas stations throughout Gladwin, Gladwin County Clerk’s office, the County’s web site [www.gladwinco.com](http://www.gladwinco.com) and the Gladwin County Record.

**Q: Where can I get the City’s maps?**

**A:** They will be out soon. Beaverton is all open unless posted closed, Gladwin will be publicized soon. We will also have City maps when we rework the County map.
